

Trans-NIDDK Short-Term Training for Medical Students

The goal of the proposed trans-NIDDK Short-Term Training Program for Medical Students is to expose medical students to career opportunities in basic or clinical research related to diabetes, obesity, endocrine disorders, metabolic diseases, nutritional disorders, digestive diseases, liver diseases, kidney diseases, urologic diseases and hematologic disorders. Sixteen medical students may participate for three months (or less) of the summer. We are particularly interested in recruiting minority students both from this institution and outside institutions. Monthly financial support for the student is equal to that of the Summer Research Fellowships.

Medical students entering this program will pair with faculty on this training grant to develop a three-month summer research program. They will participate in a weekly series of talks devoted to developing academic skills. Medical students participating in this program will be encouraged to continue their project and undergo further training in basic or clinical research by entering the MA/MD and/or the Medical Scientist Training Program.
